Setting aside the month before Christmas to reflect on Jesus' coming has been a tradition since the 6th century and is referred to as Advent. The word "advent" comes from the Latin and means "the coming." The custom of lighting a candle or candles on each of the four Sundays before Christmas has been part of many cultures. The Viking Christians were the ones who created the Advent wreath.

This <u>Countdown to Christmas</u> booklet continues in the Advent tradition with a Bible reading and poem for each day from November 30 to December 26. After reading the Scripture, ask and answer the questions: "What does the Scripture mean?" and "Why is that important to know?" A black and white booklet that can be colored in daily by a child is also available.







As you open presents,

By dying for us on the cross, salvation he did bring.




Jesus' mother was a virgin

December 3—Matthew 1:18-25




Mary was engaged to Joseph,

and there was no place to stay.




The Savior would be born

Shepherds were out in the fields taking care of all their sheep.


Through the entire night, good watch they had to keep.

was born a baby boy.


The Son of God had come to earth to bring all people joy.

under Mary's loving care.




God warned the men in a dream, to go home a different way,

And Mary they did find there, with Jesus at her chest.



December 11—Numbers 24:17a




Far away from Bethlehem,
