## Lesson Rhyme

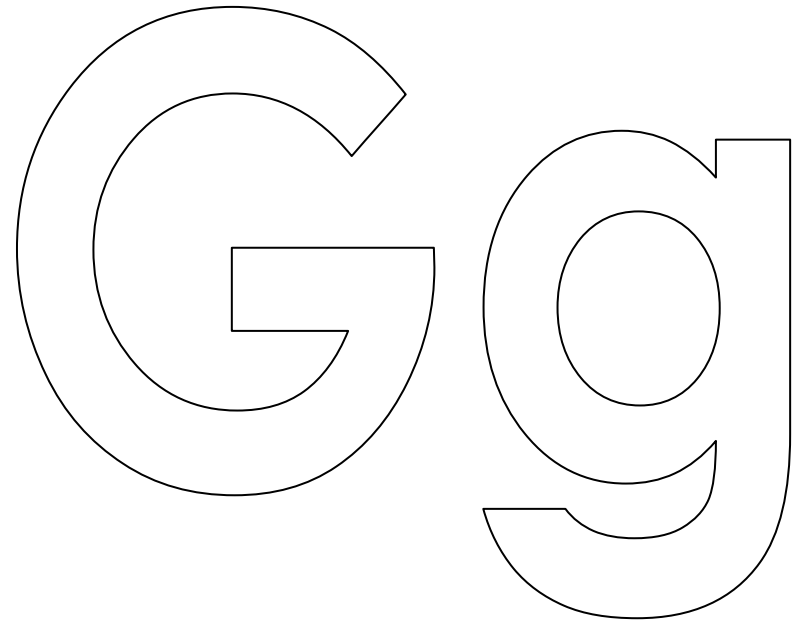
G—G	Make sign of G
