REVIEW

Big Question: How is Jesus the Light?

LESSON CONTENT

Introduction:

Show visual. (picture 5-1)

What is this a picture of?

On the second day of creation God separated the waters he had made into two parts. God put a space or an expanse between the two waters to separate them. The part above formed the sky and the part below formed the earth. Before God made the sun or the stars he made the earth we live on. The earth is the most important part of God's creation. He put water on earth and air around it so he could create life. Every living thing needs water and air. God knows all things and made earth to be a home for living things.

Jesus called himself the Living Water. Without the water Jesus gives, we die both spiritually in our souls and physically in our bodies.

<u>The Big Question for this week is:</u> For what should we thirst? Listen as I read the lesson book and see if you can answer the question afterwards.

Title: What does life need?

Page 1 - Genesis 1:6-8
(picture of clouds/air over ocean)
When God created earth,

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Discussion Questions:

Page 1: What did God do to the water? What did God call "sky"?

Page 2: Why did God put air and water on earth? Where do we find water on earth?

Page 3: What things contain water?

Page 4: Why can't we see air? Where is the air?

<u>Page 5:</u> What is in the air that we need? How did God design our bodies to take in air? What would happen to us if we couldn't breathe? Why?

<u>Day 6:</u> Why is Jesus called the living water? If Jesus is living water, what should we do? What does that mean?

Review: Select a couple questions from above to ask the students again.

- <u>Prayer:</u> Thank God that he is the everlasting and almighty creator. Thank him for the water and air that sustains the life he created. Thank you for Jesus being the Living Water.
- <u>The Big Question:</u> For what should we thirst?

We are to thirst for God like our bodies thirst for water.

• Craft: Life mobile

As a reminder that God has given all that we need for life, make a life mobile.

Materials: cover stock paper, scissors, string

<u>Preparation:</u> Run off EC craft 5 on white cover stock paper. Cut pieces apart. Each student should have one of each piece. Punch a hole over each small circle.

Instructions:

- 1. Cut out the pieces along the outside lines.
- 2. Tie the rain drop, cloud and sun to the circle piece.
- 3. Tie a loop of string through the top of the circle.
- Investigation Activity: The attraction of water molecules

When God gathered the waters together he caused water molecules to stick together. This means he created a strong attraction between water molecules which causes them to draw and hold together. This attraction between water molecules causes water to have very strong surface tension.

<u>Materials:</u> clear glass, small plate, water, medicine dropper, small paper clips Instructions:

- 1) Set a clear glass on a plate and fill it to the very top with water. Add water with a medicine dropper to the point where water spills over the edge. At that point, the cup is completely full.
- 2) Explain that you will be putting paper clips into the water. Ask the children how many paper clips they think you can put into the glass without the water flowing out over the top.
- 3) Gently slide paper clips into the water. Have the children count the clips and observe the rim of the glass.
- 4) Questions: How many paper clips could we slide into the full glass of water? Where was the water in terms of the glass before the last paper clip caused it spilled over the rim of the glass? (It should have risen above the rim.) What caused the water to spill over the rim? (Surface tension breaks down when the weight of the water and the pull of gravity are too great.) Why is it important for water molecules to have a strong attraction for one another? (It causes water to hold together and flow easily.)

JOURNAL

The journal is passed out at the end of class for the students to complete at home. It has six poetic readings and related Bible verses. It would be beneficial for the teacher to read through and be familiar with its content.
