
Daily Reading Questions

- <u>Day 3</u>: What does it mean that God is infinite? What does God do for his creation? What does it mean that God is the one and only? What does it mean that God lives eternally?
- <u>Day 4</u>: How does God know what we are thinking? If God knows our thoughts what should we think about? Why? What does God know about us? What should that cause us to do? Why?
- <u>Day 5</u>: What does Jesus want for us? How Jesus like a shepherd?
