

# **Concluding Lesson**


<u>Review</u>: What is the water cycle? Why is the water cycle important?

### Day 6 Draw a picture of the ocean and clouds.

### Day 5 Draw a picture of the water cycle

### Day 2 Draw a picture of the ocean.

He keeps it going all the time so water we can find.

<u>Job 37:10-12</u>: <sup>10</sup> By the breath of God ice is given, And the broad waters are frozen. <sup>11</sup> Also with moisture He saturates the thick clouds; He scatters His bright clouds. <sup>12</sup> And they swirl about, being turned by His guidance, That they may do whatever He commands them On the face of the whole earth.

### Day 3 Draw a picture of the sun shining on the ocean.

When the sun shines down on water some will turn to gas,
Water vapor rising up to form a cloudy mass.
The clouds move over land, when the wind does blow.
Droplets form and fall, as rain or sleet or snow.
