



### Day 1 Draw a picture of a seed sprouting.

God created different plants.

They grow all around.

Most sprout up from a seed,

### Day 6 Draw a picture of your favorite plant.

God looked at plant design and said that plants were good.

<u>Psalm 104:13-14</u>: <sup>13</sup> He waters the mountains from his upper chambers; the earth is satisfied by the fruit of his work. He makes grass grow for the cattle, and plants for man to cultivate— bringing forth food from the earth.

### Day 5 Draw a picture of one of the plants described.

There are plants that grow in water, in the sea there is seaweed, While in the desert there are plants that don't much water need. One thing that is the same with every plant you find, They will only reproduce after their own kind.

### Day 3 Draw a picture of one of the trees described.

### Day 4 Draw a picture of one of the plants described.

With a multitude of branches, bushes grow like trees. Some bushes may have flowers, which will attract the bees. Grasses tend to spread around, growing from a stem. While vines grow up a tree, and hang down from a limb.

1 Peter 1:24-25: <sup>24</sup> "All men are like grass, and all their glory is like the flowers of the field; the grass withers and the flowers fall, <sup>25</sup> but the word of the Lord stands forever."
