LESSON CONTENT

• Introduction: Show visual (picture 17-1)

What is this a picture of?

After God created Adam and Eve, he told them to have children and to fill the earth and to rule over it. When God tells people to rule over the earth that means that people are to use God's creation wisely and for good purposes. They take care of the animals and the plants and trees and make the land produce good things.

<u>The big question for this week is: What responsibility has God given to man?</u> Listen as I read the lesson book and see if you can answer the question afterwards.

• Lesson Book: Read the book. Refer to the discussion questions.

Title: How is man to rule the Earth?

<u>Page 1—Genesis 1:28</u> (picture of Earth) When God created Adam, he gave Eve as his wife. He told them both to marry and fill the earth with life. The earth God had created he entrusted it to man. Wanting man to rule it in the best way that he can. <u>Page 2—Psalm 115:16</u> (picture of people gardening) To God we are accountable for everything we do. So we want to know and follow what is good and true. Under man's authority, God put every thing. So we should treat earth well and to God great glory bring.

<u>Page 3—Psalm 103:17-18</u> (picture of a kid composting) That means we steward earth and all it does contain. We understand that hurting earth, causes God real pain. Steward means take care of and use all things with care. Not wasting precious resources that God gave us to share. <u>Page 4—Ecclesiastes 5:11-12</u> (picture of too much stuff) We want to rule earth wisely, so God will be quite glad. So we don't indulge ourselves or follow every fad. We are mindful of our attitude; we're not filled with greed. We're careful that we only buy the things we really need. <u>Page 5—Psalm 8:6-8</u>
(picture of child feeding a horse)
The earth and every living thing we treat with due respect,
Because taking care of planet earth is what God does expect.
Living things need air and water so they can grow and thrive
So we take care of the earth and what things need to stay alive.

Page 6—Psalm 106:2-3

(picture of a family walking in nature)
We appreciate the greatness of God and all he's done,
Thanking him for making the earth, the stars, and sun.
When we look at God's creation, we see God made it good.
So we try to take good care of it in the way we should.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Page 1: What did God want Adam and Eve to do? What does entrust mean?

Page 2: What are we accountable to God for? What does that mean we should do?

Page 3: What does it mean to steward the earth?

Page 4: What makes God glad? What does it mean to indulge ourselves? What is greed?

Page 5: How are we to treat living things? What does that mean we do?

<u>Page 6:</u> What should we thank God for? What does it mean that God made creation good? What does that mean we should do?

<u>Review:</u> Select a couple questions from above to ask the students again.

<u>**Prayer:**</u> Thank God for the goodness of his creation and all that he has made and done. Thank him for giving man the responsibility to rule over the earth. Pray that you would treat his creation with respect and care.

<u>The Big Question:</u> What responsibility has God given to man? God gave the earth to man to take care of.

ACTIVITIES

Any age appropriate activity can be included which fits into the club time. The activities with a star are included on the class notes handout sheet.
