Lesson Rhyme


T—T	Make sign of "T" with right hand

Day 1 Draw a picture of Abraham

Day 2 Draw a picture of Abraham and Isaac.

<u>Genesis 22:1-2</u>: ¹ Some time later God tested Abraham. He said to him, "Abraham!" "Here I am," he replied. ² Then God said, "Take your son, your only son, Isaac, whom you love, and go to the region of Moriah. Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains I will tell you about."

Day 3 Draw a picture of Isaac on the altar.

Abraham took Isaac and on the altar him did lay. Because Abraham believed God and was faithful to obey. He trusted God completely, in his promises didn't doubt. He knew that in God's plan, something would work out.

Day 4 Draw a picture of the ram God sent.

Abraham!" "Here I am," he replied. ¹² "Do not lay a hand on the boy," he said. "Do not do anything to him. Now I know that you fear God, because you have not withheld from me your son, your only son."
