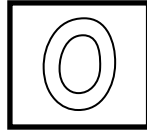

Each Animal After Its Own Kind

On the sixth day of creation God made the animals that live on the ground. Snakes and lizards are animals called reptiles. Reptiles lay eggs and are cold-blooded. Cold-blooded means that when the temperature outside is cold they are also cold and can't move.
