Daily Reading Questions

Note: The questions were written from the wording in the NIV 1984. If you are using a different Bible translation, they may have to be adapted.

Digging Deeper: What can we trust God to do for us?

Reading 1: Psalm 145:13b-21 God fulfills the desires of those who fear him.

What is God's attitude toward all he has created? What does God do for those who fear him? What kind of desires will people who fear God have? Why? What will happen to the wicked? Why is that?

Reading 2: Deuteronomy 8:1-5 God will reveal what is in our heart. How did God provide for his people in the desert? Why did he do that? What does that mean?

Reading 3: Deuteronomy 8:6-20 God gives us the ability to produce wealth.

What kind of land was God bringing the people into? What were they to be careful not to do? Why? What would happen if they forgot God?

Reading 4: Isaiah 55:1-7 God has mercy on those who turn to him. What kind of bread will satisfy us? What will God do for those who come to him and listen to him? On whom does God have mercy? Why?

Reading 5: John 14:1-4 God is preparing an eternal home for us. What is Jesus doing for us? Why is that important to remember?

Reading 6: 1 Corinthians 10:23-32 Nutrition Evaluation

Evaluate how well you are being fed both physically and spiritually. Reflect on what makes a good diet and then evaluate whether you are eating enough variety and good quality of plant food. Reflect on how a person is fed spiritually and evaluate how well you are being fed.

Parent Notes

- **Daily Reading:** Depending on the age and ability of your child, or parent preference, he/she may do the work in this journal independently or complete it with the parent. After reading the day's Bible passage, the student should identify an important truth that relates to that reading and answer the question why he/she needs to know that truth. It would be beneficial if the parent and student also read through and answer the questions about the day's reading from the **Daily Reading Questions** at the back of the booklet. Personal ideas and additional questions from the parent can also be included.
- **Lesson Verse:** The lesson verse which answers the week's big question should be practiced daily. One way to do this is to black out words in the verse each day and say the verse inserting the correct word. By the end of the week the whole verse would be blacked out and recited by memory.
- **Concluding Lesson:** To develop deeper understanding and a comprehensive biblical worldview, the parent should talk through with the student the **Thinking It Through** questions at the back of the booklet and then have the student write out the answers.
- **Completion:** If the student brings this booklet back to the teacher on Sunday, with each day's work completed and the lesson verse memorized, the student will receive acknowledgement of a job well done.
- **Way to go, parents!** Your faithfulness in teaching your children the deed and statutes of the Lord isn't always easy, but it honors God and will have an eternal impact. Keep up the good work! Remember Galatians 6:9, *Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up.*
