Concluding Lesson



Day 5 Draw a picture of animals in the stable.

Day 2 Draw a picture of Gabriel speaking to Mary

Day 3 Draw a picture of Mary and Joseph

She was pledged to marry Joseph and be his loving bride.
Even though the baby wasn't his, he stayed right by her side.
An angel had told Joseph to take Mary as his wife,
Because by the Holy Spirit the child was given life.

Matthew 1:18-20: 18 Now the birth of Jesus Christ was as follows: After His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Spirit. 19 Then Joseph her husband, being a just *man*, and not wanting to make her a public example, was minded to put her away secretly. 20 But while he thought about these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take to you Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit.

Day 4 Draw a picture of Mary on a donkey.

God had chosen Bethlehem
as the birthplace of his Son,
So people of all nations
would know he was the One.
So Mary and Joseph traveled
on a donkey far away.
When they arrived in Bethlehem
they found no place to stay.

<u>Luke 2:4-5</u>: ⁴ Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, ⁵ to be registered with Mary, his betrothed wife, who was with child.
