

LESSON CONTENT

• Introduction: Show visual (picture 23-1)

What is this a pictures of?

When God created Adam he was all alone. God knew that Adam needed a helper so he created Eve to be Adam's wife. Adam and Eve were the first married couple. God wanted them to have children and fill the earth with people. In marriage a man and woman come together in a one flesh relationship to make a new family.

The big question for this week is: What is special about the marriage relationship? Listen as I read the lesson book and see if you can answer the question afterwards.

• Lesson Book: Read the book. Refer to the discussion questions.

Title: What is God's design for marriage?

Page 1—Genesis 2:21-22
(picture of Adam and Eve)
When God created Adam,
he was all alone,
So God put him deep to sleep
and took from him a bone.
From Adam's rib God made Eve,
so he would have a wife.
God wanted them to marry
and live a happy life.

Page 2—Genesis 2:23
(picture of a couple)
Marriage God designed to join
 a husband to a wife.

And when a wife and husband
 treat each other right,
They reflect to all the world
 God's goodness and his light.

Page 3—Genesis 2:24
(picture of a wedding)
A man must leave his parents;
a wife will leave hers too.

a man and woman are as one.
Once they're joined in marriage,
a new family is begun.

Page 4—Ephesians 5:23-25

The role of leadership
God has given to the man,
And the woman is to help him
in every way she can.

When couples do what is right,

God's plan for a family
is something really swell.

Page 5—Ephesians 6:1-3
(picture of parents instructing their children.)
The family is the place
where children learn and grow.
Parents are to train their kids
so God's way they will know.
The children are to listen
and do what parents say.
It is God's command
that their parents kids obey.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Page 1: Why did God create Eve? How did God create Eve?

<u>Page 2:</u> What is God's design for marriage? What happens when a wife and husband treat each other right?

Page 3: What happens when a man and woman are joined in marriage?

<u>Page 4:</u> What is the role of the man in marriage? What is the role of the woman in marriage? What happens when a man and woman do what God says?

<u>Page 5:</u> What are parents to do for their children? What are children to do for their parents?

Page 6: What is God's design for marriage?

Review: Select a couple questions from above to ask the students again.

<u>Prayer:</u> Thank God that everything he does is good. Thank God for your parents and a family where you can learn and grow. Pray that everyone in your family would want to do what God says is right. Pray for anyone in your family who hasn't followed God's good design that they would experience God's forgiveness and healing.

The Big Question: What is special about the marriage relationship?

In marriage, a man and a woman become one flesh.

ACTIVITIES

Any age appropriate activity can be included which fits into the club time. The activities with a star are included on the class notes handout sheet.

★ Lesson Rhyme: Practice the lesson rhyme with movements.

• Craft: Heart

As a reminder that God designed a man and a woman to come together in marriage make heart.

Materials: cover stock paper, transparency or yellow and blue tissue paper, scissors, tape

<u>Preparation:</u> Run off the heart page on cover stock paper and the blue and yellow page on a transparency or cut the tissue paper into squares that will cover the heart. Cut the heart page in half so each child has two connected hearts.

<u>Instructions:</u> Cut out the center of each heart. Tape a square of the blue transparency or tissue on top of one heart and a yellow one on top of the other. Fold the heart page together so that the taped side is inside. The heart should now show green demonstrating how a man joined to a woman become one flesh (heart).

JOURNAL

The journal is passed out at the end of class for the students to complete at home. It has six poetic readings and related Bible verses. It would be beneficial for the teacher to read through and be familiar with its content.
