
4For the word of the LORD is right and true; he is faithful in all he does. 5The LORD loves righteousness and justice; the earth is full of his unfailing love.

6By the word of the LORD were the heavens made, their starry host by the breath of his mouth. 7He gathers the waters of the sea into jars; he puts the deep into storehouses. 8Let all the earth fear the LORD; let all the people of the world revere him. 9For he spoke, and it came to be; he commanded, and it stood firm.

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Level 2—Parent Notes:



Concluding Lesson

<u>Review</u>: Who are the three persons of God? How many Gods are there? What does it mean that God is holy and perfect? How can we honor God? How is God different from us? Why can't we see God? How do we know that God is real? Why is God worthy of praise? What is praise? What can we do to praise God? What does it mean to exalt God? What is shame? How do we bring shame on ourselves? How do we please God?

<u>Prayer</u>: Thank God that he is God and worthy of honor and praise. Pray that you would learn to honor and exalt him more. Thank him for giving you life and pray that you would live your life in a way that honors him.

<u>Application</u>: Make a list of things God has done and characteristics of who he is that make him worthy of worship. Thank him for doing and being those things.

<u>Dictation</u>: Have the child dictate what important truth was learned from the lesson. Have the child repeat back the dictation, trace over the letters and draw a picture to go with it.

Day 1 Draw a picture of you worshiping God.

Our God is holy, perfect: Father, Spirit, Son. Although he is three persons, he is really only one. As he is holy, perfect, there is nothing he does wrong, And so to him in worship we exalt his name in song.

Day 6 Draw a happy picture of yourself.

When we honor and exalt God, we are doing what is right. Our hearts are filled with joy, understanding and God's light. But if we follow other gods, our lives will always lack. In chasing after what is wrong, we cause God to turn his back.

<u>Hebrews 1:3</u>: ³ The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven. <u>Psalm 100:2-3</u>: ² Worship the LORD with gladness; come before him with joyful songs. ³ Know that the LORD is God. It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, the sheep of his pasture.

Day 5 Draw a picture of yourself doing something good.

Exalt means that we honor God and praise his holy name. We worship and adore him, not do what brings him shame. We understand that through him we have everything we need. So we do what pleases him, In thought and word and deed.

Day 2

Draw a picture of you looking into the sky.

God is very different, he is not like us at all. While he is great and mighty, we are very small. He doesn't have a body; he's a spirit everywhere. So we cannot see his face, like we cannot see the air.

<u>Psalm 99:1-3</u>: ¹ The LORD reigns, let the nations tremble; he sits enthroned between the cherubim, let the earth shake. ² Great is the LORD in Zion; he is exalted over all the nations. ³ Let them praise your great and awesome name he is holy. <u>Isaiah 44:6</u>: ⁶ "This is what the LORD says— Israel's King and Redeemer, the LORD Almighty: I am the first and I am the last; apart from me there is no God.

Day 3 Draw a picture of different things God has made.

But we know that God is real; he created you and me. He made the things around us, everything that we can see. Because he is creator, he is worthy of our praise. So to honor and exalt him, we in worship voices raise.

Day 4 Draw a picture of Jesus on the cross.

Jesus is the Son of God; he's God in every way. So we honor and exalt him in what we do and say. Jesus helps us understand the love God has for men. Since he gave his life to rescue us, saving us from sin.

<u>Colossians 1:16</u>: ¹⁶ For by him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things were created by him and for him. <u>Colossians 1:19-20</u>: ¹⁹ For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, ²⁰ and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross.
