<sup>25</sup> And they were both naked, the man and his wife, and were not ashamed.



## **Level 2—Parent Notes:**

# **Concluding Lesson**


<u>Review</u>: What is God's design for marriage? What happens when a wife and husband treat each other right? What are parents told to do for their children? What are children to do for their parents?
