¹⁷ Cain lay with his wife, and she became pregnant and gave birth to Enoch. Cain was then building a city, and he named it after his son Enoch. ¹⁸ To Enoch was born Irad, and Irad was the father of Mehujael, and Mehujael was the father of Methushael, and Methushael was the father of Lamech.

¹⁹ Lamech married two women, one named Adah and the other Zillah. ²⁰ Adah gave birth to Jabal; he was the father of those who live in tents and raise livestock. ²¹ His brother's name was Jubal; he was the father of all who play the harp and flute. ²² Zillah also had a son, Tubal-Cain, who forged all kinds of tools out of bronze and iron. Tubal-Cain's sister was Naamah.

²³ Lamech said to his wives, "Adah and Zillah, listen to me; wives of Lamech, hear my words. I have killed a man for wounding me, a young man for injuring me. ²⁴ If Cain is avenged seven times, then Lamech seventy-seven times."

²⁵ Adam lay with his wife again, and she gave birth to a son and named him Seth, saying, "God has granted me another child in place of Abel, since Cain killed him." ²⁶ Seth also had a son, and he named him Fnosh.

At that time men began to call on the name of the LORD.



What is the impact of an upright father?

MEMORY VERSE

<u>Psalm 112:1-2</u>

Level 3—Parent Notes:

- <u>Daily Reading</u>: Depending on the age and ability of the child, or parent preference, the child may do the work in this journal independently or read with and dictate an answer to the parent. After reading the day's rhyme and the Bible verse, the child should draw a picture that relates to that day's reading and answer the question at the bottom of the page. Have the child answer questions about the day's reading from the <u>Daily Reading</u> <u>Questions</u> at the back of the booklet. Personal ideas and additional questions from the parent can also be included.
- Lesson Verse: The lesson verse which answers the week's big question should be practiced daily. One way to do this is to black out words in the verse each day and say the verse inserting the correct word. By the end of the week the whole verse would be blacked out and recited by memory. Depending on the age and/or ability of the child, either the whole verse or the part of the verse between brackets on the cover can be memorized.
- Concluding Lesson: The parent should discuss with the child the Thinking it Through questions: What important truth did you learn this week? How can you apply that truth in your life? After discussing the questions the child should write down (or dictate to the parent) the answers and a prayer at the end of the booklet. The child can then complete the other activities.
- <u>Completion</u>: If the student brings this booklet back to the teacher on Sunday, with each day's work completed and the lesson verse memorized, the student will receive acknowledgement of a job well done.
- Way to go, parents! Your faithfulness in teaching your children
 the deed and statutes of the Lord isn't always easy, but it honors
 God and will have an eternal impact. Keep up the good work!
 Remember Galatians 6:9, Let us not become weary in doing good,
 for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up.

<u>Day 5</u>: What makes life go wrong? How do we overcome our own evil? (Note: Evil is anything that falls short of the good God desires.)

<u>Day 6</u>: What would cause a person to trust in Jesus? What does trusting in Jesus do for us? What does it mean to be just?

Concluding Lesson

Review: Because of Adam's sin what do most people do now? What did Cain do? What was the earth like in the beginning? How did living in a wonderful place affect people? What happened to the earth after the Fall? What does trusting in Jesus do for us?

<u>Prayer</u>: Thank God for giving you life. Pray for God's work in your heart, that you would want to be right with God and follow after Jesus. Thank God for sending Jesus so that you can overcome your sin and do what's right and just.

<u>Application</u>: Discuss how people's actions show what their heart is inclined to. Have the child think about his own actions and what they reveal about him.

<u>Thinking It Through</u>: Have the child write or dictate what important truth was learned from the lesson, how he/she can apply that truth, and a prayer to God.
