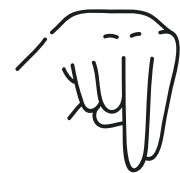

LESSON CONTENT

- **Introduction:** Show visual **(picture 29-1)**

What is this a picture of?

At the time of Noah, everyone, but Noah and his family, was doing what was wrong and the earth was filled with evil. God told Noah to build an ark. An ark is a big boat. Because Noah loved God, he obeyed him and built an ark, even though there wasn't any water in which the ark could float. God said he was going to send a flood of lots of water and wipe everything off the earth that wasn't safe inside the ark.

(picture 29-2) God sent every type of animal in pairs to go on the ark. Because Noah had faith, believed God and built the ark, he and his family and the animals were kept safe when God sent the flood.

The big question for this week is: What does it take to please God?

Listen as I read the lesson book and see if you can answer the question afterwards.

- **Lesson Book:** Read the book. Refer to the attached daily discussion questions.

Title: What was Noah's faith like?

Page 1 – Hebrews 11:7

(picture of Noah building the ark)

Faith means that you believe
all that God has said.

You trust in God completely,
keep his truth inside your head.

Noah had great faith;
he knew that God is good.

So in faith he built an ark,
out of cypress wood.

Page 2 – Genesis 6:13-14

(picture of Noah and the ark)

God he had decided
to rid the world of sin.

To wipe life from the earth
and then begin again.

But those inside the ark
would be safe and sound

As Noah had great faith
and righteous he was found.

Page 3 – Genesis 6:17

(picture of ark on the water)

God would send a flood
to cover everywhere.

There'd be nothing left,
as earth would be wiped bare.

But those inside the ark
would weather out the storm

Safe inside the ark,
they'd be dry and warm.

Page 4 – Genesis 6:18

(picture of people in the flood waters)

God protects the righteous
who walk along his path.

While the wicked perish,
consumed by holy wrath.

God hates all that's evil,
the wicked cannot stand.

While those with faith in Jesus
are protected by his hand.

Page 5 – Genesis 6:20, 22

(picture of animals going on ark)
Noah built the ark by faith,
according to God's plan,
And God kept Noah safe,
along with all his clan.
Into the ark God also sent,
animals of each kind.
Those not inside the boat
all were left behind.

Page 6 – Genesis 7:1

(picture of Jesus)
The flood it teaches us the need
to walk in Jesus' light,
To turn away from evil
and follow what is right.
Even when toward evil
all others are inclined.
In faith we'll follow Jesus
and truth will fill our mind.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Day 1: What is faith? How did Noah show he had faith?

Day 2: Why did God decide to wipe life from the earth? Why did God keep Noah and his family safe?

Day 3: What would cover the whole earth? What would the earth be like after the flood? What would happen to those inside the ark?

Day 4: Who are the righteous? What does God do for the righteous? What happens to the wicked? What is holy wrath?

Day 5: What did Noah do by faith? What did God do because of Noah's faith? What is a clan? How did Noah's faith help others?

Day 6: What does the flood teach us? Why does it teach us that?

Review: Select a couple questions from above to ask the students again.

- Prayer: Thank God that he is faithful and trustworthy to do all that he has said and teach us what is right and good. Pray that you would grow in faith as Noah did and follow all that God says is good.
- The Big Question: **What does it take to please God?**
A person must have faith to please God.

ACTIVITIES

Any age appropriate activity can be included which fits into the club time. The activities with a star are included on the class notes handout sheet.

★ **Lesson Rhyme:** Practice the lesson rhyme with movements.

★ **Activity:** Drawing

Draw a picture of your favorite animal.

★ **Letter/Sound Recognition:** Say the sound of and trace over each letter in the boxes.
With which sound does Faith begin?

• **Craft:** The ark

Materials: card stock paper, small craft sticks, crayons or colored pencils, glue sticks

Preparation: Run off EC craft 29 on card stock paper. Cut in half

Instructions: Have the children glue craft sticks to the ark. They can draw animals underneath it.

Questions: Talk about all the different animals Noah would have brought on the ark.

• **Activity:** Talk about what type of food Noah would have taken on the ark. Show types of grain seeds like rice, wheat, oats and popcorn and examples of what we eat that come from them. Have the children eat some dried fruit and beef jerky. Talk about why those foods would have been good to take on the ark.

• **Song:** Rise and Shine (on back page)

JOURNAL

The journal is passed out at the end of class for the students to complete at home. It has six poetic readings and related Bible verses. It would be beneficial for the teacher to read through and be familiar with its content.
