# **REVIEW**

• Big Question: What is the result of honoring parents?

Life will go well for children who honor their parents.

#### LESSON CONTENT

• <u>Introduction:</u>Show visual (picture 34-2)

What is this a picture of?

After the flood instead of spreading out over all the earth like God had told them to do, the people lived together in one place. They wanted to honor themselves instead of God so they started building a tall, tall tower to reach up to the heavens.

God wasn't happy with what the people were doing. They were able to do a lot of bad things together because they all spoke the same language and lived in the same place. They were full of pride and forgot about God. God put an end to this by changing their languages and sending them to different places to live.

The big question for this week is: What is the result of honoring parents? Listen as I read the lesson book and see if you can answer the question afterwards.

• <u>Lesson Book:</u> Read the book. Refer to the attached daily discussion questions. Title: What happened at the Tower of Babel?

Page 1—Genesis 11:1-2

(picture of a city)

God told the people they should move and settle all the land.

And if they chose to do what's right, he'd keep them in his hand.

But the people were quite proud; they thought they were so great.

So they stayed together and did not se-par-ate

Page 3—Genesis 11:6-7

(picture of confused people)

God he wasn't pleased.

He said doing this was bad.

The arrogance and pride of men made him very sad.

God confused their language so they couldn't understand.

And each and every family was sent to a different land.

Page 5—Matthew 6:9-10

(picture of people arguing)

God is the Lord of all;

there is nothing he can't do

So all men should acknowledge him and what he says is true.

Instead people tend to follow

after things that are not good.

Then they fail to honor God and listen as they should.

Page 2—Genesis 11:4

(picture of people building a tower)

As they lived together,

one language they did speak.

To love and follow God,

they didn't choose to seek.

Instead they said they should build a tower to the sky.

In that way they thought they'd lift their own name way up high.

Page 4—Genesis 11:8-9

(picture of a broken down tower)

All the people in the world,

originally were one.

But God Almighty intervened

because of what they'd done.

They no longer were one people;

they couldn't build the tower.

At Babel God showed all the world his great might and power.

Page 6—Mathew 6:12-13

(picture of Jesus)

God he is long suf-fer-ing.

His love will never end.

To deal with sin and make men right

to earth his Son did send. Don't follow what is evil

and chase after what's not right.

Instead believe in Jesus

and live in his good light.

#### **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

<u>Day 1:</u> What did God tell the people to do after the flood? What did the people do instead? Why?

Day 2: What did the people decide to do? What was wrong with their doing that?

Day 3: Why wasn't God pleased with the people? What did he do to them?

<u>Day 4:</u> What does it mean to intervene? How did God intervene? What did God show about himself when he intervened?

<u>Day 5:</u> Why should people acknowledge God? What do people tend to do? Why do they do that?

<u>Day 6:</u> What does it mean to be long suffering? How is God long suffering? How has God given people a way to be made right? What does that mean for you?

Review: Select a couple questions from above to ask the students again.

- <u>Prayer:</u> Thank God that he is long suffering and doesn't punish you as your sins deserve. Thank Jesus for dying for your sins so you could be made right. Pray that you would truly honor God and want to do what he says.
- The Big Question: What is the result of honoring parents? Life will go well for children who honor their parents.

Any age appropriate activity can be included which fits into the club time. The activities with a star are included on the class notes handout sheet.



#### • Craft: Build a tower

As a reminder that building the Tower of Babel caused God to confuse the language of the people and scatter them over all the earth, build a tower.

Materials: copy paper, glue sticks, scissors, cotton balls, green crayons

Preparation: Run off craft 34 EC on copy paper. Cut apart paper and bricks.

<u>Instructions:</u> Have the students cut out the bricks to build a tower. Cover the clouds with cotton balls and color the grass green.

Questions: What were the people building? Why didn't God like the tower? How many blocks are in the tower you built?

# • Activity: Build a tower

Bring in blocks or Legos and have the children build tall towers. See which child can build the tallest tower before it topples over.

### • Game: Backward relay

As a reminder that Shem and Japheth honored their father by not looking at him when he was drunk and naked, run backwards relay races.
