³ By faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible.



Level 3—Parent Notes:

- <u>Daily Reading</u>: Depending on the age and ability of the child, or parent preference, the child may do the work in this journal independently or read with and dictate an answer to the parent. After reading the day's rhyme and the Bible verse, the child should draw a picture that relates to that day's reading and answer the question at the bottom of the page. Have the child answer questions about the day's reading from the Daily Reading Questions at the back of the booklet. Personal ideas and additional questions from the parent can also be included.
- <u>Lesson Verse</u>: The lesson verse which answers the week's big question should be practiced daily. One way to do this is to black out words in the verse each day and say the verse inserting the correct word. By the end of the week the whole verse would be blacked out and recited by memory. Depending on the age and/or ability of the child, either the whole verse or the part of the verse between brackets on the cover can be memorized.
- <u>Concluding Lesson</u>: The parent should discuss with the child the Thinking it Through questions: What important truth did you learn this week? How can you apply that truth in your life? After discussing the questions the child should write down (or dictate to the parent) the answers and a prayer at the end of the booklet. The child can then complete the other activities.
- <u>Completion</u>: If the student brings this booklet back to the teacher on Sunday, with each day's work completed and the lesson verse memorized, the student will receive acknowledgement of a job well done.
- <u>Way to go, parents!</u> Your faithfulness in teaching your children the deed and statutes of the Lord isn't always easy, but it honors God and will have an eternal impact. Keep up the good work! Remember Galatians 6:9, *And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart.*


<u>Review</u>: What is faith? How did Noah show he had faith? Why did God keep Noah and his family safe?

#29 What does it take to please God?



A person must have faith to please God.

Day 1 Draw a picture of Noah building the ark.

Faith means that you believe all that God has said. You trust in God completely, keep his truth inside your head. Noah had great faith; he knew that God is good. So in faith he built an ark. out of cypress wood.

Day 6 Draw a picture of you and Jesus.

The flood it teaches us the need to walk in Jesus' light, To turn away from evil and follow what is right. Even when to evil all others are inclined. In faith we'll follow Jesus and truth will fill our mind.

What does the verse mean?

<u>Hebrews 11:7</u>: ⁷ By faith Noah, being divinely warned of things not yet seen, moved with godly fear, prepared an ark for the saving of his household, by which he condemned the world and became heir of the righteousness which is according to faith.

What does the verse mean?

<u>Genesis 7:1</u>: ¹ Then the Lord said to Noah, "Come into the ark, you and all your household, because I have seen *that* you *are* righteous before Me in this generation.

Day 5 Draw a picture of Noah's family in the ark.

Noah built the ark by faith, according to God's plan, And God kept Noah safe, along with all his clan. Into the ark God also sent, animals of each kind. Those not inside the boat all were left behind.

Day 2 Draw a picture of Noah and the ark.

God he had decided to rid the world of sin. To wipe life from the earth and then begin again. But those inside the ark would be safe and sound As Noah had great faith and righteous he was found.

What does the verse mean?

<u>Genesis 6:20, 22</u>: ²⁰ Of the birds after their kind, of animals after their kind, and of every creeping thing of the earth after its kind, two of every *kind* will come to you to keep *them* alive. ²² Thus Noah did; according to all that God commanded him, so he did. What does the verse mean?

<u>Genesis 6:13-14</u>: ¹³ And God said to Noah, "The end of all flesh has come before Me, for the earth is filled with violence through them; and behold, I will destroy them with the earth. ¹⁴ Make yourself an ark of gopherwood; make rooms in the ark, and cover it inside and outside with pitch.

Day 3 Draw a picture of the ark on the water.

God would send a flood to cover everywhere. There'd be nothing left, as earth would be wiped bare. But those inside the ark would weather out the storm Safe inside the ark, they'd be dry and warm.

Day 4 Draw a picture of people outside the ark.

God protects the righteous who walk along his path. While the wicked perish, consumed by holy wrath. God hates all that's evil, the wicked cannot stand. While those with faith in Jesus are protected by his hand.

What does the verse mean?

<u>Genesis 6:</u>17: ¹⁷ And behold, I Myself am bringing floodwaters on the earth, to destroy from under heaven all flesh in which *is* the breath of life; everything that *is* on the earth shall die. What does the verse mean?

<u>Genesis 6:18</u>: ¹⁸ But I will establish My covenant with you; and you shall go into the ark-you, your sons, your wife, and your sons' wives with you.
