<sup>29</sup> As he approached Bethphage and Bethany at the hill called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, <sup>30</sup> "Go to the village ahead of you, and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. 
<u>Review</u>: What is praise? Who are we to praise? Why should we praise Jesus? How do we know Jesus is God?
