28 After the Sabbath, at dawn on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to look at the tomb.



Level 2—Parent Notes:

- <u>Daily Reading</u>: Read the entire booklet to the child. Go back to the appropriate day, reread the content and have the child answer questions about it from the **Daily Reading Questions** at the back of the booklet. Include personal ideas and additional questions. Read and discuss the daily Bible verse if appropriate for the child. Have the child draw a picture related to the content.
- <u>Lesson Rhyme</u>: Read the Lesson Rhyme on the next page, saying the sound of the letter instead of its name. Point to each word as you read it. Discuss the meaning of the rhyme. Have the child trace the letter with a finger and say its sound. Practice with the child the signs that go along with the Lesson Rhyme (included below). Review and repeat the rhyme every day.

Concluding Lesson



Day 1 Draw a picture of Jesus on the cross.

When they crucified our Lord it was a sad and dreadful day,
But the punishment for all our sins someone had to pay.
Into his hands and feet with a hammer nails were driven.
It is through Christ's pain and suffering that we have been forgiven.



Draw a picture of Jesus.

We are blessed when we believe what we have not seen, Thanking God through Jesus from our sin we are made clean. We are to trust in Jesus as God's one and only Son. Knowing through his resurrection, death was overcome.

Luke 23:33⁻³³ When they came to the place called the Skull, they crucified him there, along with the criminals—one on his right, the other on his left.

John 20:29–²⁹ Then Jesus told him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

Day 5 Draw a picture of the risen Christ.

Jesus rose up from the dead; they were no longer sad. He proved that he is God which made them really glad. Through his resurrection, death he overcame. Now forgiveness and salvation are found in Jesus' name.

Day 2 Draw a picture of Jesus being taken down.

When Jesus died they took him down and laid him in a grave. Mockers still were saying, "His own life he couldn't save." The disciples were confused as they knew what he had said. In three days, he had claimed, he would rise up from the dead.

1 John 4:13-14⁻¹³ This is how we know that we live in him and he in us: He has given us of his Spirit. ¹⁴ And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world. Luke 23:34-35⁻³⁴ Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." And they divided up his clothes by casting lots. ³⁵ The people stood watching, and the rulers even sneered at him. They said, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is God's Messiah, the Chosen One."

Day 3 Draw a picture of the tomb and rock.

A rock was rolled across the opening of the tomb. His followers were sad and their hearts were filled with gloom. But as they went back to their homes and on their beds did lay. They put their trust in God to work things out his way.

Day 4

Draw a picture of the women at the tomb.

Some women went back to the tomb his body to prepare. Imagine their surprise when they couldn't find it there. The stone that covered up the tomb had been rolled away. The body of our Savior in the grave no longer lay.

John $19:41-42^{-41}$ At the place where Jesus was crucified, there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb, in which no one had ever been laid. ⁴² Because it was the Jewish day of Preparation and since the tomb was nearby, they laid Jesus there.

John 20:1-2-Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance. ² So she came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him!"
