NURSERY CONCEPT

God rescues those who do what is right.

LESSON CONTENT

Explanation:(picture 37-1) What is this a picture of?

Abraham had a nephew named Lot who lived in the town of Sodom. The people in the town were very bad and did wicked things so God had decided to destroy it. Abraham asked God to save the town if there were ten good men in it.

There weren't even ten good men in the city, but God sent two angels to rescue Lot and his family because they weren't being bad. When they were leaving the city, the angels told Lot and his family not to look back at the town. Lot's wife disobeyed God and she was turned into a pillar of salt.

Then God rained burning fire down on the town to destroy it and everyone who lived there. God hates wickedness but he extends his hand to save those who do what is right.
