Then there was food in Egypt when there wasn't any rain.




All around the world there were seven years of drought.

They could no longer grow it as there wasn't any rain.




Into Joseph's presence the brothers had to go.

He had been made ruler; it was part of God's good plan.




When Joseph told them who he was, they were quite afraid.
