Daily Reading Questions

Note: The questions were written from the wording in the NIV 1984. If you are using a different Bible translation, they may have to be adapted.

Journal Focus – Genesis, chapters 19-21

Reading 1: Genesis 19:30-38 Lot's daughters take matters into their own hands.

NOTE: In this passage Lot's daughters took matters into their own hands and did what was wrong to do. They did what the people in Sodom and Gomorrah would have done. The children that were born to them became the ancestors of nations that did what was evil and were bitter enemies of Abraham's descendants. What was wrong with what Lot's daughters did? What does this tell you about them? What should they have done in that situation?

Reading 2: Genesis 20 Abraham lies about Sarah.

Why did Abraham not tell the truth about Sarah being his wife? What does that show about Abraham? Why is a half truth the same as a lie?

Reading 3: Genesis 21:1-7 Isaac is born.

What is noteworthy about the birth of Isaac? What can you learn from that?

Reading 4: Genesis 21:8-21 Hagar and Ishmael are sent away.

What did Sarah ask Abraham to do with Hagar? What does that show you about Sarah? What did God promise Abraham concerning Ishmael? What did God do for Hagar and Ishmael? What does that show you about God?

Reading 5: Genesis 21:22-34 Abraham makes a treaty with Abimelech.

What was the problem between Abraham and Abimelech? How did they solve it? What can you learn from that?

Reading 6: 2 Peter 2:1-12 The wicked will be destroyed.

What do false teachers do? In the past what did God do to those who promoted evil? What is he able to do for the righteous? Why do we all deserve death? What has God given to us that we don't deserve? What can you learn from this?

MEMORY VERSE

2 Peter 2:9-10a

The Lord knows how to rescue godly men from trials and to hold the unrighteous for the day of judgment, while continuing their punishment. This is especially true of those who follow the corrupt desire of the sinful nature and despise authority.

Parent Notes

- **Daily Reading:** Depending on the age and ability of your child, or parent preference, he/she may do the work in this journal independently or complete it with the parent. After reading the day's Bible passage, the student should identify an important truth that relates to that reading and answer the question why he/she needs to know that truth. It would be beneficial if the parent and student also read through and answer the questions about the day's reading from the **Daily Reading Questions** at the back of the booklet. Personal ideas and additional questions from the parent can also be included.
- **Lesson Verse:** The lesson verse which answers the week's big question should be practiced daily. One way to do this is to black out words in the verse each day and say the verse inserting the correct word. By the end of the week the whole verse would be blacked out and recited by memory.
- **Concluding Lesson:** To develop deeper understanding and a comprehensive biblical worldview, the parent should talk through with the student the **Thinking It Through** questions at the back of the booklet and then have the student write out the answers.
- **Completion:** If the student brings this booklet back to the teacher on Sunday, with each day's work completed and the lesson verse memorized, the student will receive acknowledgement of a job well done.
- **Way to go, parents!** Your faithfulness in teaching your children the deed and statutes of the Lord isn't always easy, but it honors God and will have an eternal impact. Keep up the good work! Remember Galatians 6:9, *Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up.*
