

Level 2—Parent Notes

- ⇒ Daily Journal: Each day read the Scripture and discuss what it means. Then read the poem and have the child answer questions about it from the Daily Reading Questions. Include personal ideas and additional questions. Under the daily poem have the child draw a picture related to the content or dictate a sentence about what it means.
- ⇒ Lesson Rhyme: Read the Lesson Rhyme on the front page, saying the sound of the letter instead of its name. Point to each word as you read it. Discuss the meaning of the rhyme. Review and repeat the rhyme every day using the Lesson Rhyme Signs.
- ⇒ Concluding Lesson: Complete the activities under Concluding Lesson in the booklet.
- Completion: If the student brings this booklet back to the teacher on Sunday, with each day's work completed and the lesson rhyme memorized, the student will receive acknowledgement of a job well done.

Daily Reading Questions

<u>Day 1</u>: Who is our Savior? Who did God say he'd send before Jesus began his work on earth? Who was that prophet?

<u>Day 2</u>: Who were John's parents? What were they like? What made them sad?

<u>Day 3</u>: What were Zechariah and Elizabeth always faithful to do? Where did Zechariah serve? What does unnerved mean?

<u>Day 4</u>: Who appeared to Zechariah? What happened to Zechariah when he saw Gabriel? What did Gabriel say to Zechariah?

<u>Day 5</u>: Why didn't Zechariah believe Gabriel? What happened to Zechariah because he didn't believe what Gabriel said?

<u>Day 6</u>: Who did Elizabeth give birth to? What did God send John to do?

Concluding Lesson
