

Level 2—Parent Notes

- ⇒ Daily Journal: Each day read the Scripture and discuss what it means. Then read the poem and have the child answer questions about it from the Daily Reading Questions. Include personal ideas and additional questions. Under the daily poem have the child draw a picture related to the content or dictate a sentence about what it means.
- ⇒ Lesson Rhyme: Read the Lesson Rhyme on the front page, saying the sound of the letter instead of its name. Point to each word as you read it. Discuss the meaning of the rhyme. Review and repeat the rhyme every day using the Lesson Rhyme Signs.
- ⇒ Concluding Lesson: Complete the activities under Concluding Lesson in the booklet
- Completion: If the student brings this booklet back to the teacher on Sunday, with each day's work completed and the lesson rhyme memorized, the student will receive acknowledgement of a job well done.


LESSON RHYME

Daily Reading Questions

<u>Day 1:</u> A virgin is a woman who has never been with a husband. God designed a husband and a wife to have babies. For a woman to have a baby without having a man as a partner would never happen. Why would God say a virgin (a woman without a man) would have a baby?

<u>Day 2:</u> What did the angel Gabriel say to Mary? Why would what the angel said make Mary afraid? What did the fact that Mary obeyed God say about her?

<u>Day 3:</u> Who was Mary engaged to? Why could Joseph have chosen not to marry Mary? What did the angel tell Joseph to do?

<u>Day 4:</u> Why did Joseph marry Mary? Why was it important that Mary and Joseph were from the family (line) of King David?

<u>Day 5:</u> What was the place God had said his Son would be born? Where were Mary and Joseph from? Why were they in Bethlehem?

<u>Day 6:</u> Why was Jesus born in a stable? Why do you think God had his Son be born in a stable?

Concluding Lesson

Review: What did the angel Gabriel say to Mary? Who was Mary engaged to? Why could Joseph have chosen not to marry Mary? Why was it important that Mary and Joseph from the family (line) of King David? What was the place God had said his Son would be born? Why was Jesus born in a stable?

<u>Prayer</u>: Thank God for sending his Son to be our Savior and that the birth of Jesus fulfilled Old Testament prophecy about the Messiah. Thank God for the great gift he has given us through his Son.

<u>Application</u>: What are the things you do at Christmas that cause you to remember it is a celebration of the birth of Jesus. Think of ways you can make Christmas this coming year more about Jesus and his birth.

<u>Dictation</u>: Have the child dictate what important truth was learned from the lesson. Have the child repeat back the dictation, trace over the letters and draw a picture to go with it.
