PICTURES NEEDED

8-1 Temptation to turn stone into bread

NURSERY CONCEPT

Jesus always did what is right.

LESSON CONTENT

Explanation: (Show lesson picture) (picture 8-1)

What is this a picture of?

Jesus was led by the Holy Spirit to go into the desert where he didn't eat for forty days. The devil tried to get Jesus to go against God and do things God wouldn't want him to do.

Because Jesus was so hungry, Satan told him to turn a stone into bread but Jesus said that being right with God is as important as eating.

Jesus didn't do what Satan wanted because he fully trusted God the Father and wanted to do what was right. Jesus always did what is right.

QUESTIONS

Why did Jesus go into the desert? What did Satan do to Jesus? Why didn't Jesus do what Satan wanted?

PRAYER

Pray that you would be like Jesus, trust God and do what God wants you to do?.

BIG QUESTION (This is for reference only. The nursery children are not expected to learn it.)

How do we keep from giving into Satan's temptations?

We are to resist the devil and submit ourselves to God.
