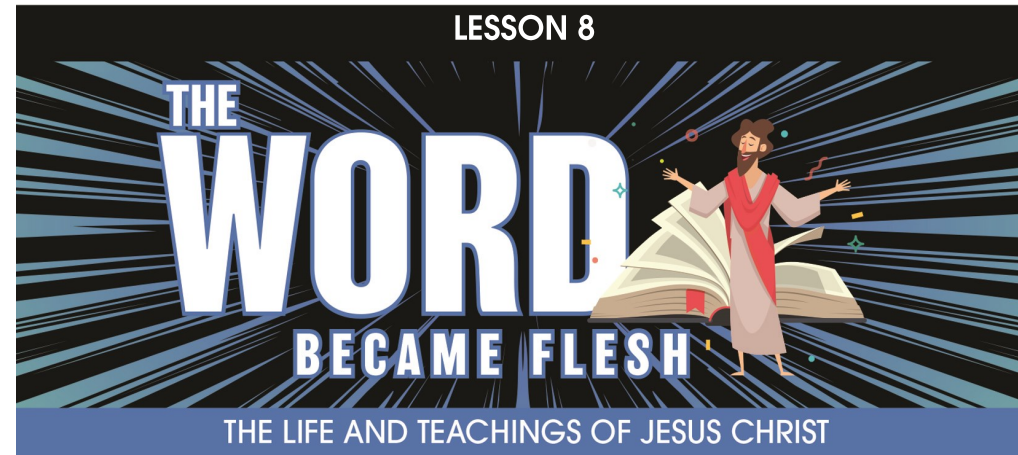

Level 2—Parent Notes

- ⇒ **Daily Journal:** Each day read the Scripture and discuss what it means. Then read the poem and have the child answer questions about it from the *Daily Reading Questions*. Include personal ideas and additional questions. Under the daily poem have the child draw a picture related to the content or dictate a sentence about what it means.
- ⇒ **Lesson Rhyme:** Read the *Lesson Rhyme* on the front page, saying the sound of the letter instead of its name. Point to each word as you read it. Discuss the meaning of the rhyme. Review and repeat the rhyme every day using the *Lesson Rhyme Signs*.
- ⇒ **Concluding Lesson:** Complete the activities under *Concluding Lesson* in the booklet.
- ⇒ **Completion:** If the student brings this booklet back to the teacher on Sunday, with each day's work completed and the lesson rhyme memorized, the student will receive acknowledgement of a job well done.
- ⇒ **Way to go, parents!** Your faithfulness in teaching your children the deeds and statutes of the Lord isn't always easy, but it honors God and will have an eternal impact. Keep up the good work! Draw a loaf of bread, a crown and a building to remind you of Satan's temptations.

Daily Reading Questions Lesson 8

Day 1: Where was Jesus led to go? Why was he so hungry? What was he doing while he was in the desert? What was Satan doing?

Day 2: What did Satan want to do to Jesus? What was the first thing Satan said to try to get Jesus to sin? How did Jesus respond to Satan? What does that mean?

Day 3: What was the second thing Satan said to try to get Jesus to sin? How did Jesus respond to that?

Day 4: What did Jesus focus on? How did Jesus respond to all of Satan's temptations?

Day 5: What was the last thing Satan tried to get Jesus to do? How did Jesus respond to that? What does that mean?

Day 6: Why would Jesus have been able to sin? Why didn't Jesus sin? How do we keep from sinning?

Concluding Lesson 8

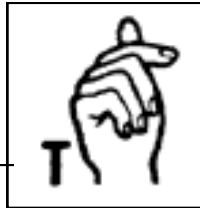
Prayer: Thank Jesus that he understands what it means to be tempted and that he can help you when you are tempted. Pray that you would want to follow him and his truth rather than Satan's temptations.

Application: Sin is anything that hurts us or others. Think of a sin that you continually do. What is it about that sin that makes you want to give into it? What does God say about that sin? What do you need to do to keep from giving in to that sin?

Dictation: Have the child dictate what important truth was learned from the lesson. Have the child repeat back the dictation, trace over the letters and draw a picture to go with it.

DAILY JOURNAL 8— How was Jesus tempted?

Day 1— Luke 4:1-2

After he was baptized,
to the desert Christ was led.

Day 2—Luke 4:3-4
