

Level 2—Parent Notes

- Daily Journal: Each day read the Scripture and discuss what it means. Then read the poem and have the child answer questions about it from the Daily Reading Questions. Include personal ideas and additional questions. Under the daily poem have the child draw a picture related to the content or dictate a sentence about what it means.
- ⇒ Lesson Rhyme: Read the Lesson Rhyme on the front page, saying the sound of the letter instead of its name. Point to each word as you read it. Discuss the meaning of the rhyme. Review and repeat the rhyme every day using the Lesson Rhyme Signs.
- ⇒ Concluding Lesson: Complete the activities under Concluding Lesson in the booklet.
- Completion: If the student brings this booklet back to the teacher on Sunday, with each day's work completed and the lesson rhyme memorized, the student will receive acknowledgement of a job well done.

DAILY JOURNAL 14 — On what should we build our lives?

Day 1— Matthew 7:24-25
