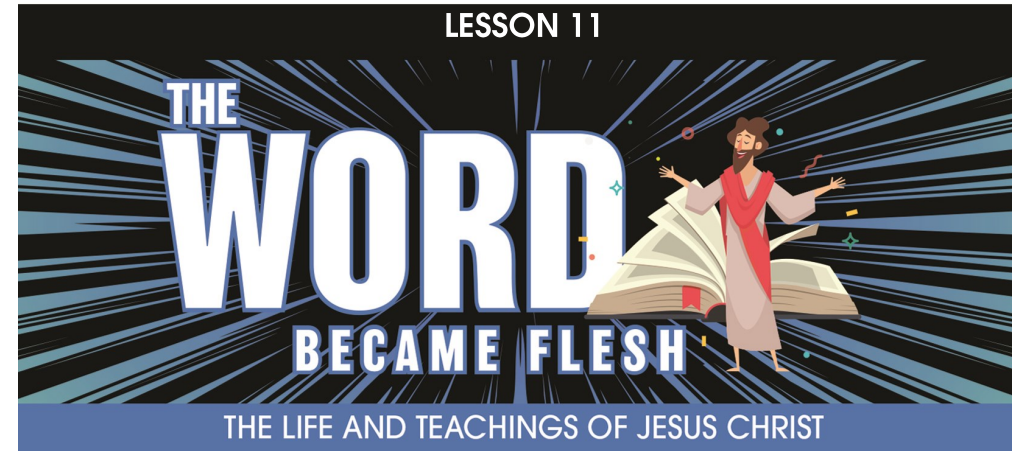

Level 3—Parent Notes

- ⇒ **Daily Journal:** Each day read the Scripture and discuss what it means. Then read the poem and have the child answer questions about it from the *Daily Reading Questions*. Include personal ideas and additional questions. Under the daily poem have the child draw a picture related to the content or write a sentence about what it means.
- ⇒ **Lesson Verse:** The lesson verse which answers the week's big question should be practiced daily. One way to do this is to black out words in the verse each day and repeat the verse inserting the correct word. By the end of the week the whole verse would be blacked out and recited by memory. Depending on the age and/or ability of the child, either the whole verse or the part of the verse between brackets on the cover can be memorized.
- ⇒ **Concluding Lesson:** Complete the activities under the *Concluding Lesson*. In the booklet.
- ⇒ **Completion:** If the student brings this booklet back to the teacher on Sunday, with each day's work completed and the lesson verse memorized, the student will receive acknowledgement of a job well done.
- ⇒ **Way to go, parents!** Your faithfulness in teaching your children the deeds and statutes of the Lord isn't always easy, but it honors God and will have an eternal impact. Keep up the good work! Day 1: What is a miracle? What was the first miracle Jesus did? How do miracles show that Jesus came from God?

Day 2: How did Jesus get to his disciples in a boat? Why would they have been terrified? Why would they have worshipped Jesus when they saw what he did?

Day 3: Why were the people in the crowd hungry? How did they get fed? What do you think the people thought after that?

Day 4: What is a paralytic? How did the paralytic get to Jesus? What two things did Jesus do for the paralytic? Which was most important for the man? Why?

Day 5: What was the greatest miracle that Jesus did? What is that such a great miracle? What does rising from the dead show about Jesus?

Day 6: What kind of miracles did the Apostles do? Why did they do miracles? How do miracles help people come to know Jesus?

Concluding Lesson

Review: What is a miracle? What was the first miracle Jesus did? What are other miracles Jesus did? How do miracles show that Jesus came from God?

Prayer: Thank God that he is God and different from men. Thank him for sending his Son to save you from your sin. Thank him for the miracles that Jesus did that show he is the Son of God and your Savior.

Application: Read to the child about a miracle Jesus did from a Bible story book. Have the child practice telling the story and then share it with someone else.

Thinking It Through: Have the child write or dictate what important truth was learned from the lesson, how he/she can apply that truth, and a prayer to God.

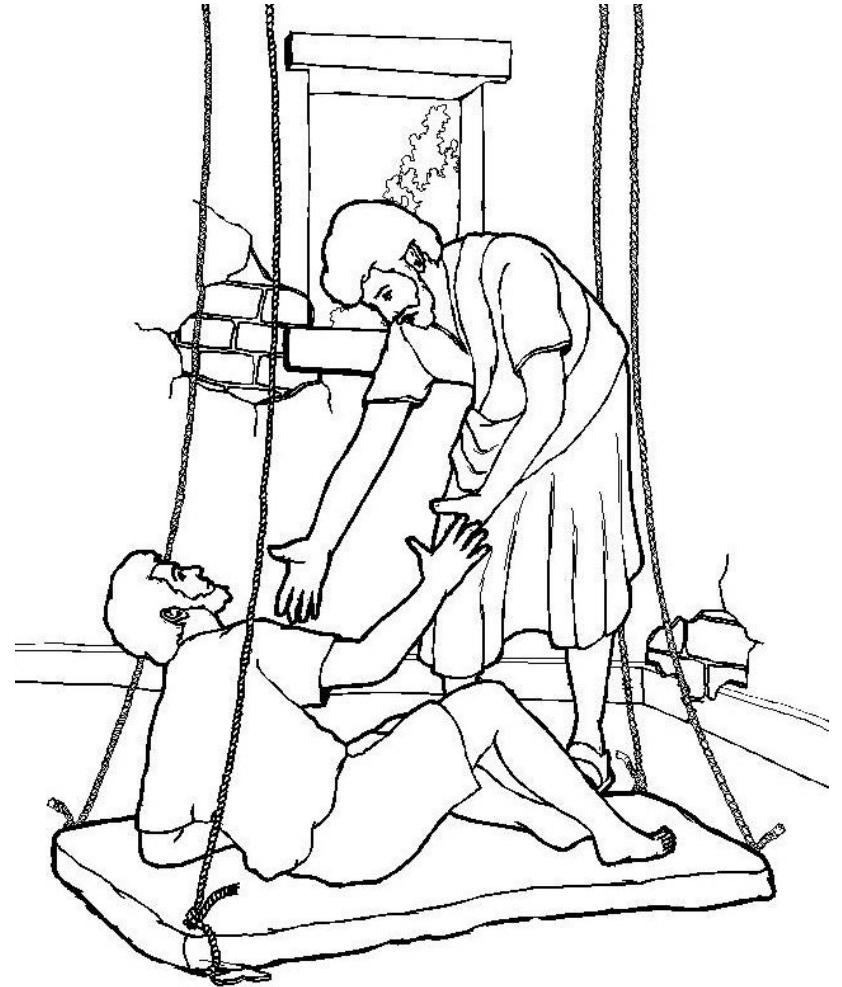
