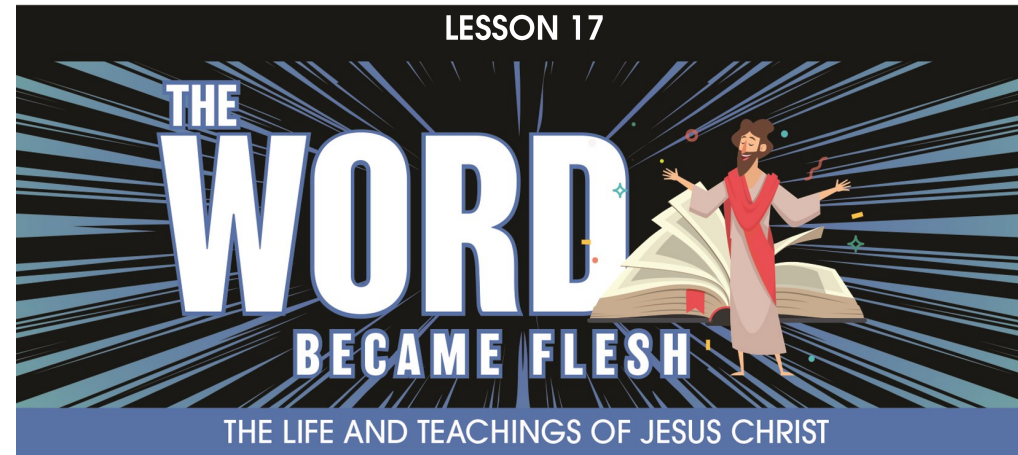

Level 2—Parent Notes

- ⇒ **Daily Journal:** Each day read the Scripture and discuss what it means. Then read the poem and have the child answer questions about it from the *Daily Reading Questions*. Include personal ideas and additional questions. Under the daily poem have the child draw a picture related to the content or dictate a sentence about what it means.
- ⇒ **Lesson Rhyme:** Read the *Lesson Rhyme* on the front page, saying the sound of the letter instead of its name. Point to each word as you read it. Discuss the meaning of the rhyme. Review and repeat the rhyme every day using the *Lesson Rhyme Signs*.
- ⇒ **Concluding Lesson:** Complete the activities under *Concluding Lesson* in the booklet.
- ⇒ **Completion:** If the student brings this booklet back to the teacher on Sunday, with each day's work completed and the lesson rhyme memorized, the student will receive acknowledgement of a job well done.
- ⇒ **Way to go, parents!** Your faithfulness in teaching your children the deeds and statutes of the Lord isn't always easy, but it honors God and will have an eternal impact. Keep up the good work! Grows up in good ground



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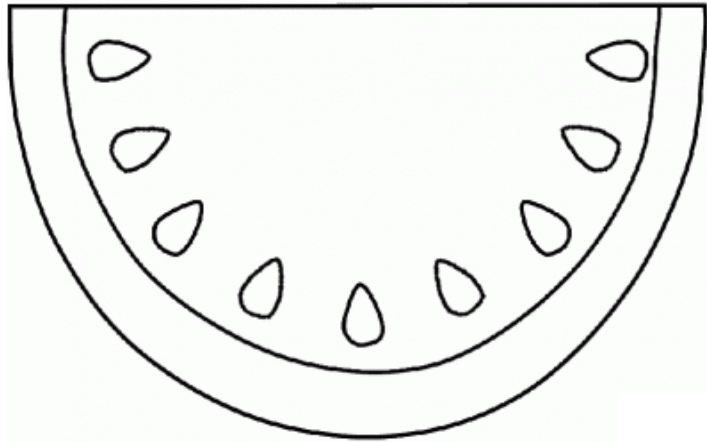

Daily Reading Questions

Day 1: What does the farmer do with the seed? What determines whether or not a plant will grow from a seed? What is the seed God sows? Where is that seed sown?

Day 2: What happens to the seed that falls on the path? Why?

Day 3: What does Satan want to do? When is he able to do that?

Day 4: What happens to the seed that lands in the rocks? What happens to God's truth in a person's heart when it is like the rocks?

Day 5: What happens to the seed that is sown among the weeds? Why can't the truth grow in the middle of weeds?

Day 6: What happens to the seed that is sown in good soil? Why does it grow and produce a crop?

Concluding Lesson

Review: What determines whether or not a plant will grow from a seed? What is the seed God sows? Where is that seed sown? What happens to the seed that falls on the path? Why? What happens to the seed that lands in the rocks? What happens to God's truth in a person's heart when it is like the rocks? What happens to the seed that is sown among the weeds? Prayer: Thank God for his word that produces a good crop in a good heart. Pray that your heart would receive his truth.

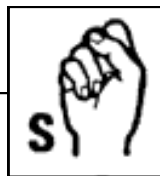
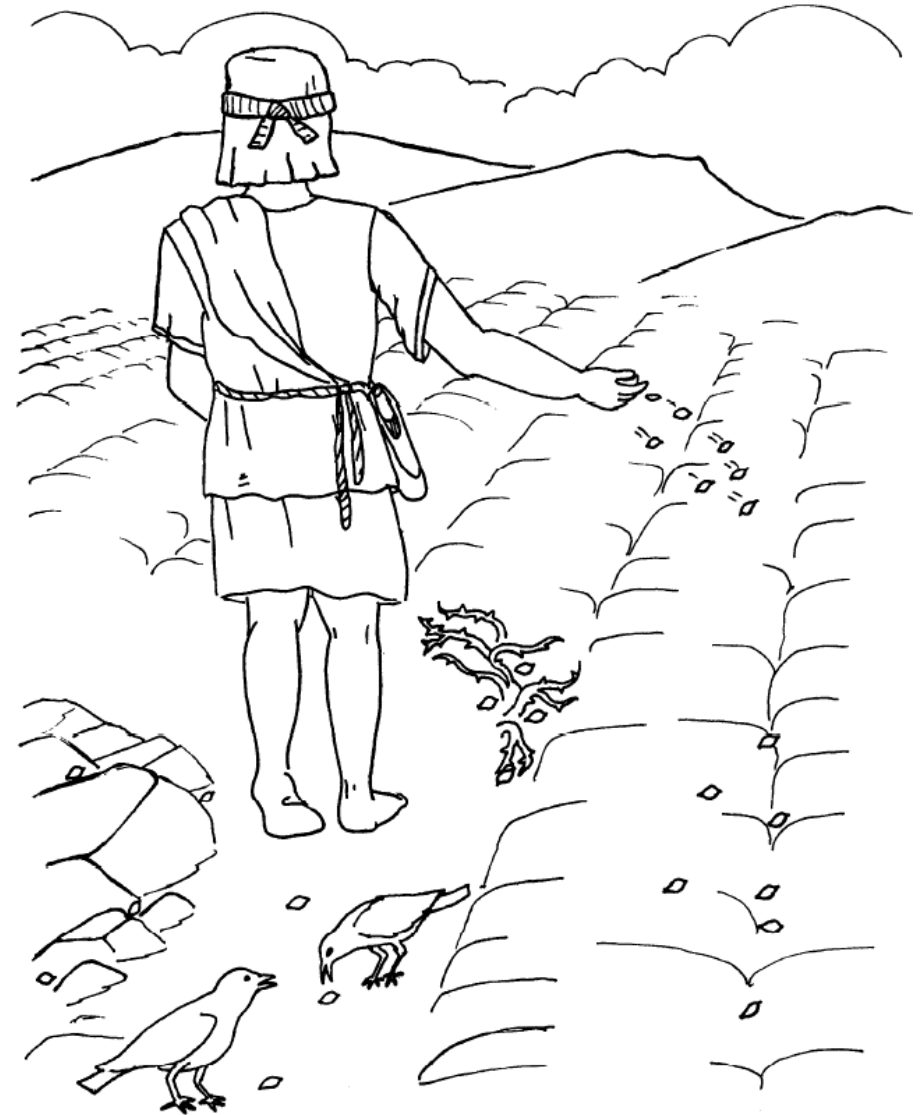
Application: Every day study a truth from God's word.

Lesson Rhyme Signs

S—S	Make sign of "S"
Seed	Right hand palm down, rub four fingers against thumb
Gets sown	Use R hand to throw out seed from L hand all around
S—S—Seed	Same as above
Grows up in good ground	Right hand behind left, move up and spread fingers Thumbs up sign



DAILY JOURNAL 17— What happens to the seed of truth?

Day 1— Luke 8:5-8

The farmer takes the seed
and sows it all around.
If a plant will grow from it
depends upon the ground.
God sows the seed of truth
in each and every heart.
Whether it produces fruit

Day 2—Luke 8:11

If the seed lands on a path,
the birds will see it there.
As it lies there all alone,

Day 3—Luke 8:12

Satan wants to steal God's truth
so it can't root in a heart.

Day 4—Luke 8:13

The seeds that land among the rocks

will make one fall away.

Day 5—Luke 8:14

Other seed will be sown
in among the weeds.

Among the weeds can't sprout.

Day 6—Luke 8:15

In a heart that's well prepared,
truth won't be snatched away.
