
Level 3—Parent Notes

- Daily Journal: Each day read the Scripture and discuss what it means. Then read the poem and have the child answer questions about it from the Daily Reading Questions. Include personal ideas and additional questions. Under the daily poem have the child draw a picture related to the content or write a sentence about what it means.
- ⇒ Lesson Verse: The lesson verse which answers the week's big question should be practiced daily. One way to do this is to black out words in the verse each day and repeat the verse inserting the correct word. By the end of the week the whole verse would be blacked out and recited by memory. Depending on the age and/or ability of the child, either the whole verse or the part of the verse between brackets on the cover can be memorized.
- ⇒ Concluding Lesson: Complete the activities under the Concluding Lesson. In the booklet.
- Completion: If the student brings this booklet back to the teacher on Sunday, with each day's work completed and the lesson verse memorized, the student will receive acknowledgement of a job well done.
- ⇒ Way to go, parents! Your faithfulness in teaching your children the deeds and statutes of the Lord isn't always easy, but it honors God and will have an eternal impact. Keep up the good work!

<u>Day 1</u>: What were the disciples wondering about in the storm? Why was Jesus able to sleep during the storm when the disciples were so afraid?

<u>Day 2</u>: What did Jesus do to the wind and waves? What does rebuke mean? How did Jesus have the power to rebuke the wind and waves?

<u>Day 3</u>: Why does all of creation obey Jesus?

<u>Day 4</u>: What can Jesus do just by speaking? What should you do when you are afraid? Why?

Day 5: Why can you completely trust Jesus?

<u>Day 6</u>: What does it mean that Jesus has a purpose for everything that happens? What does it mean to call on Jesus' name? Why can you call on his name?

Concluding Lesson

<u>Review</u>: What were the disciples wondering about in the storm? Why was Jesus able to sleep during the storm when the disciples were so afraid? What did Jesus do to the wind and waves? Why can you completely trust Jesus?

<u>Prayer</u>: Thank Jesus that all things are under his power and that you belong to him. Pray that you would learn to trust him more and seek him when you are afraid. Thank him that he is always with you, knows all things and answers prayer.

<u>Application</u>: Ask people to tell you stories of what happened when they were afraid and called on Jesus in prayer. Share things that have happened to you when you prayed to Jesus.

<u>Thinking It Through</u>: Have the child write or dictate what important truth was learned from the lesson, how he/she can apply that truth, and a prayer to God.
